It is testified by Elisha De Haque the younger Gentleman
Steward of this Manor that on the sixteenth day of November which was in the
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty six John
Sparkhall late of Wells next the Sea then of Great Brittain in the
County of Norfolk Proprietor a Copyhold Tenant of the said Manor
came before Thomas Mondham Gentleman Deputy Steward for this
purpose only and out of Court according to the Custom of the said
Manor did surrender out of his Hands into the Hands of the Lord
of the said Manor by the Rod in the presence of William Gunton
Mondham a credible Person attending the same All and every
the Messuages Lands Tenements and Hereditaments whatsoever
and wheresoever of him the said John Sparkhall holden of the said
Manor by Copy of Court Roll with their and every of their
Appurtenances And the Reversion and Reversions Remainder and
Remainders Rents Issues and Profits thereof and of every part and
parcel thereof And also all the Estate Right Title Use Trust
Interest Inheritance Equity and benefit of Redemption Claim and
Demand whatsoever of him the said John Sparkhall of in to or out
of the same and every part and parcel thereof together with all and
every their Rights Members Liberties Emoluments Privileges and
Appurtenances To the Use and behoof of Robert Curson of Morley
Daniel Buttolph in the said County of Norfolk Carpenter his Heirs

Robert Curson and Assigns for ever absolutely and without any manner of Condition whatsoever NOW to this Court comes the said Robert Curson in his own proper person and humbly craves the favor of the Lord of this Manor to be admitted Tenant to the Lands and Tenements so surrendered to him as aforesaid (that is to say) To three Roods of Land lying in a certain Close called Jack's Close between the Lands formerly of Robert Seaman afterwards of William Childerhouse and now or late of Robert Vincosne on the part of the South, and the common way called Northgate Lane on the part of the north and abut upon the common called Town Green towards the east And to one piece of Land containing five Roods in Haugh Field And to one piece containing one Rood of Land in the same Field which said five Roods and one Rood are the third and fourth Pieces parcel of four Acres and one Rood in Doepham which Premises the said John Sparkhall had and took up to him and his Heirs after the Death and as Son and Heir of William Sparkhall at a General Court of Baron hold for this Manor the second Day of June which was in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty three as by the Rolls of that Court (reference thereto being had *£ s d* will appear) And the said Robert Curson is admitted Tenant to the said Lands and Premises accordingly To whom the Lord of this Manor by his own proper Hands doth grant and deliver seizin thereof by the Rod To hold to him the said Robert Curson and his Heirs of the Lord of this Manor at the will of the Lord according to the Custom of this Manor by the Rents and Services thereto due and of right accustomed saving every ones Right &c and he giving to the Lord for a fine &c and his Fealty is respited &c

Curson Robert And immediately afterwards the said Robert Curson in his own surrenders to - proper Person did surrender out of his Hands into the Hands of the Lord his Will - of this Manor by his own proper Hand by the Rod All and every the Messuages Lands Tenements and Hereditaments whatsoever of him the said Robert Curson holden of this Manor by Copy of Court Roll with their Appurtenances To the use and behoof of the last Will and Testament of him the said Robert Curson declared or to be declared &c
