Whereas at a General Court Baron holden for the said
Manor the seventh day of June One thousand seven hundred
and ninety eight John Bousell then a Copyhold Tenant of
this Manor duly surrendered All and Every his Mesuages
Lands Tenements and Hereditaments whatsoever holden of
this Manor by Copy of Court Roll To the Use and Behoof of
his last Will and Testament then already declared or therefor
to be declared.

And whereas at the last General Court
Baron holden for the said Manor the twenty ninth day of
June One thousand eight hundred and one it was presented
by the Homage of that Court that the said John Bousell
died seized of and in certain Mesuages Lands and Tenements
holden of the said Manor by Copy of Court Roll And because
not any Person then came to be admitted Tenant to the same
The first Proclamation was publickly in due form of Law
and according to the Custom of the said Manor made and
so forth.

Now to this Court cometh personally
Thomas Back the Younger of the City of Norwich Esquire and
produceth here in Court a Clause of the last Will and
Testament of the said John Bousell bearing date the
twelfth day of December One thousand and eight hundred
whereby it appears that he devised in these Words "Also I
give and devise unto my said Executors the said Thomas"

The said Thomas Back and William Hart and to their Heirs and Assigns All my Messuages Lands Tenements and Hereditaments situate lying and being in Morley in the said County of Norfolk which I bought of John Jackson and John Holmes containing Fifty five Acres of Freehold Land and which are now in the Occupation of Stephen Hubbard at the Yearly Rent of Seventy three Pounds And also all those my Messuages Lands Tenements and Hereditaments situate lying and being in Morley aforesaid ^{containing} about Forty Acres of Land two cottages a Barn and other Outhouses in the Occupation of William Pitt And also all my Messuages Lands Tenements and Hereditaments in Ditchingham in the County of Norfolk in case I shall not have completed the Sale thereof according to my Agreement with Henry Turney And also all other my Messuages Lands Tenements and Hereditaments in the City of Norwich and County of Norfolk as well Freehold as Copyhold or of any other Tenure not herein before disposed of with their and every of their Rights and Appurtenances To hold to them the said Thomas Kett Thomas Back and William Hart their Heirs and Assigns In Trust &c

As in and by the said Will now remaining in the proper Ecclesiastical Office (relation being had) will appear **And thereupon** the said Thomas Back on the behalf of himself and as Attorney for the said Thomas Kett and William Hart prayeth the Favor of the Lord of this Manor to admit them Tenants to the Messuages Lands and Tenements so devised to them and their Heirs as aforesaid and holden of this Manor by Copy of Court Roll (that is to say) **Two** one Messuage void and three Roods of Land to the same belonging formerly of Thomas Reynolds near the Messuage late of Richard Reynolds on the part of the East and abut upon the Common way

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And also to One Acre and three roods of Copyhold Land - lying in Morley Field between the Land late of John Wright on the West part and the Land formerly of Thomas Rogers on the East the North Head abuts upon the Lands of this Manor and the way called Fallowway **Which Premises** the said John Bowell had and took up to him and his Heirs on the Surrender of John Jackson Esquire at the aforesaid General Court Baron holden for the said Manor the said seventh day of June One thousand seven hundred and ninety eight As by the Rolls or Entries of that Court (relation being had) will appear

And the said Thomas Kett Thomas Back and William Hart are admitted Tenants to all and every the Messuages Lands Tenements and Premises accordingly To whom (that is) to the said Thomas Back personally and to the said Thomas Kett and William Hart (by the said Thomas Back their Attorney) - the Lord of this Manor by the Hands of his said Steward doth grant and deliver seizin thereof by the Rod. **To hold** to them the said Thomas Kett Thomas Back and William Hart and their Heirs Upon the Trusts and according to the Form and Effect of the said Will of the said John Bowell of the Lord of this Manor At the Will of the Lord according to the Custom of this Manor by the Ancient Rents Customs and Services due and of right accustomed for the same saving - the Right of every Person and so forth And they praying to the Lord his Fine and so forth And their Fealty is respited and so forth -
